About Women Rising:

For over 100 years, *Women Rising* has been assisting women and their families in need of jobs, providing safety from domestic violence, freedom from substance abuse and providing safe homes for children. This is accomplished by providing counseling, crisis intervention, workforce and job development and shelter for victims of domestic violence.

About Hope House:

Hope House, an emergency shelter for homeless women with children, helps the families become self sufficient by giving them an opportunity for decision making and for assuming responsibility for improving their situation under the support and guidance of the shelter staff.

About the Maureen Collier Senior Center:

The Maureen Collier Senior Center, named after former Councilwoman Maureen Collier is one of two senior citizen centers owned by the city and is under the direction of the Jersey City Department of Health & Human Services. The center is open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and senior can enjoy billiards, cards, exercise, dance, and other activities, all free of charge and a hot lunch is served every day.
